

The Bowling Green State University (BGSU) Master of Education in Special Education with a Specialization in Secondary Transition equips educators, rehabilitation professionals, counselors and others with the knowledge and performance skills to support youth with disabilities as they transition to adult life. Graduates are prepared to assume leadership roles in transition education and services within school and community settings.

A certificate in Secondary Transition/TTW Endorsement is embedded into the master's program or available as a stand-alone certificate. Ohio educators who complete the certificate can add the Transition-to-Work Endorsement to an intervention specialist or career-technical license.

**ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:**

Applicants are required to submit scanned copies of official or unofficial transcripts from all institutions attended. Upon admission, final official or notarized copies of transcripts from all institutions where degrees were earned and diplomas from international institutions must be submitted. Also, applicants are asked to provide a statement of purpose. One of the following test scores is required for those applying for the Master of Education program that have not already earned a master's degree: Praxis scores, OAE scores or GRE scores (within the last five years).

Those applying for the certificate program only do not have to provide test scores.

**TUITION & FEES:**

BGSU has competitive tuition for eCampus students in the program. Please refer to <https://www.bgsu.edu/bursar.html> for current tuition and fees. Not all fees in the tuition brochure apply.

**REGISTRATION PROCEDURE:**

Students request registration through the BGSU eCampus office after admission and acceptance to the program. BGSU eCampus students receive one-stop-shop services through the eCampus office, assisting them from application to graduation.

**ACADEMIC CALENDAR:**

Courses are offered in seven-week sessions throughout the year. Students can begin the program in August, October, January, March, May and June.

**DELIVERY MODE:**

The Master of Education and Certificate programs are offered 100 percent online.

**TEXTBOOK PURCHASE:**

Information available upon acceptance into the program.

**TOTAL HOURS NEEDED:**

Fifteen hours are required to complete the certificate which can be applied toward the 34 hours needed to complete the Master of Education program.

**FINANCIAL AID INFO:**

Financial Aid is available to eligible students. BGSU eCampus has an assigned financial advisor to assist students with their questions.
